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**Report Highlights:**

This report outlines the Bangladesh government's required documents from the United States to facilitate the importation of U.S. food and agricultural products. Post has not made substantive changes to the report for 2022.

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## **Executive Summary**

This report was prepared by the Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) in Bangladesh (Post) for U.S. exporters of food and agricultural products. The report gives an overview of the Bangladesh's certificate requirements for food and agricultural products. While this information strives to be as comprehensive as possible, regulations and requirements can frequently change. FAS Dhaka suggests that stakeholders closely monitor the regulating agencies' official websites for policy updates that may impact their operations. Post will provide timely reports on revised and newly issued regulations with potential significant impacts on trade. U.S. exporters are therefore encouraged to work closely with their Bangladesh importers to ensure they are aware of and complying with all current Bangladesh regulations and requirements.

The Bangladesh Food Safety Authority is the national authority responsible for ensuring food safety and food regulations in the country. Bangladesh is a signatory member of the WTO and maintains a relatively liberal and open trading system. Import Policy Order 2015-18 and 21-24 remains in effect for trading with Bangladesh ([See link](#)). Bangladesh requires official U.S. government-issued export certificates for many products including all agricultural plant, fisheries and livestock product, meat, poultry, dairy, and fresh fruit, livestock feed and ingredients, and organic products. Original certificates should accompany the product at the time of entry for all government-issued certificates. Final import approval of any products is subject to the importing country's rules and regulations as interpreted by border officials at the time of product entry.

## **SECTION IV. GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATE'S LEGAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

Original copies of necessary import documents and certificates do not need be accompanied with the product at the time of entry to the port. The exporter must send all the original documents and certificates before the time of entry to the port. The exporter must send those documents through exporting and importing country bank which also deals with the importer's Letter of Credit. The

customs and clearing agent will submit these documents to the customs house for clearing customs and port.

The certificates are valid only for the individual consignment and cannot be applied for multiple shipments. The certificates are valid for an approved period written in the import permit issued by the respective government office for importing agricultural plant and plant products. For example: import permits of agricultural plant and plant products are valid for four months from the issuing date of the import permit.

The compliance issue is absent in import regulations of agricultural and food commodities. Bangladesh doesn't require export certificate for importing agricultural commodities.

## **SECTION V. OTHER CERTIFICATION/ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS TO ENSURE MARKET ENTRY**

This section is derived from [Import Policy Order 2021-24](#).

1. Acceptable limits of radiation level for milk powder, milk food and milk products are 95 Becquerel (Bq) per kilogram of radioactive element Cesium (Cs)-137, and for other food goods are 50 Bq of Cs-137 per kilogram. The level of Cs-137 in an item shall be calculated in the state it reaches the port without being liquefied, concentrated, or processed. In case of local goods, the level of Cs-137 in an item shall be calculated in the state it is marketed. The highest acceptable limit of radioactivity levels may be revised by the government from time to time.
2. The following procedure shall be applicable in the matters of radiation test of food goods to be imported from any country, as:
  - (a) Prior to shipment of the aforesaid item(s) the inspection agent of the supplier or buyer/consignee shall make necessary arrangement for the test of radiation levels for such goods;
  - (b) Prior to the arrival of a ship carrying such goods at a Bangladeshi port, the buyer or consignee or his/her inspection agent shall make necessary arrangement for sending by courier the certificate regarding radiation level test to the concerned Customs Authority;
  - (c) No good shall be shipped with the radioactivity level above the acceptable limit;
  - (d) In case of import of food goods that were produced neither in any European country nor packed/tinned in or shipped from a third country, it is not required to submit the aforesaid certificate of the radiation level test to the Customs Authority by courier service. After collecting from exporter, the importer should provide a report on radiation level test of importable food goods mentioning the level of Cs-137 found per kilogram of the importable item; and
  - (e) A general certificate to the effect that the goods are fit for human consumption must be enclosed with the Bill of Lading (B. L.).
3. In case of direct import of rice, wheat, other cereals and food stuff from South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC), South-East Asia and Asia-Pacific Ocean countries, the provision of the above-mentioned radiation level test shall be relaxed on fulfillment of the conditions stated in import policy order 2015-18.

4. Milk products: All kinds of milk products including baby food with fat contents covered under H. S. Heading 04. 02 or 19. 01 and all H. S. Code classifiable there under shall be importable subject to the following conditions, namely:
  - (a) Baby food produced from milk shall be imported in tin containers, airtight packages or Bag in Box up to 2.5 kg;
  - (b) Milk product with cream shall be imported in the loose covered tin containers or bag in box up to 2.5 kg;
  - (c) The Industrial enterprises, which are approved by the packing or caning Sector of Board of Investment, Bangladesh Small & Cottage Industries Corporation or Director, Institute of Public Health & Nutrition, shall import milk food with cream or baby food in big airtight Hermitic Container for packing locally (retail);
  - (d) The words: “There is no alternative to breast-feeding” shall be printed clearly in relatively larger letters in Bangla in a visible space on each tin, airtight package or bag in box of baby food with cream;
  - (e) Composition and percentages of various ingredients shall be printed in Bangla on the tin containers, airtight packages or bag and boxes of milk food;
  - (I) The date of manufacture and the date of expiry (for human consumption) of milk products shall be embossed or computer printed in permanent ink either in Bangla or in English on each airtight package with tin container, or bag in box;
  - (g) The net weight of milk product shall be clearly indicated on each container in Bangla or in English; apart from this, in case of import of milk and milk product baby food, the registration number given by the Director, Institute of Public Health & Nutrition (IPIIN) shall be printed on each tin/ airtight package with tin container/ bag in box clearly;
  - (h) The condition mentioned at clauses (d), (e), (I) and (g) above must be embossed on each airtight package with tin container or bag in box and separate printed labels shall, in no way, be pasted on airtight package with tin container or bag in box;
  - (i) Measuring spoon shall be supplied airtight package with tin container or bag in box of baby food i. e. milk food having fat contents up to 19%.
5. In case of all foodstuff / edible substances importable to Bangladesh, the importers shall send information of the edible substances in a prescribed form of Bangladesh Standard & Testing Institution (BSTI) to the BSTI office and information of other food stuff to the Bangladesh Centre for Science and Industrial Research (BCSIR).
6. All foodstuff/edible substances imported into Bangladesh must undergo mandatory tests of BSTI and BCSIR. On arrival of the consignment in Bangladesh the importers shall submit samples of the goods to the BSTI/BCSIR for testing and obtain clearance certificate from them. If food stuff/edible substance does not conform to the standard, the consignment shall not be eligible for release and the importer shall be subject to legal action.
7. In case of import of food goods for human consumption as GMO (Genetically Modified Organism), LMO (Living Modified Organism) Bangladesh Bio-safety Guidelines should be followed.
8. Fish Meal and Protein Concentrate can be imported with the prior permission from the Department of Fisheries (DOF) & Department of Livestock Services (DLS) and in case of such imports source and the name of animal must be mentioned.

9. There is no need for further testing of radioactivity level of fish feed, animal and poultry feed goods after their arrival at the Bangladesh port.
10. It is to be examined by the Government recognized agency at the port of entry in Bangladesh that no Formalin is used in the imported fish and it shall be released subject to certification that there is no Formalin in it.
11. In case of import of beef, mutton or chicken or other consumable meat of animal, the date of manufacture and date of expiry must be embossed/printed on the container by the exporting country and preservation process is to be mentioned on it. Separately printed label shall not be pasted on the container.

  1. The cotton consignments on arrival at Chittagong Sea Port, Chittagong will be examined and fumigated by Quarantine officials Chittagong before release. The entire expenditure for fumigation/treatment will be borne by the importer.
  2. The import permit (IP) number shall be quoted in the Phytosanitary Certificate.

  3. The Phytosanitary Certificate should have the declaration that the Product/Commodity is non- transgenic.
  4. The Import Permit will remain valid for four month from the date of issue.
  5. The import permit (IP) number shall be quoted in the Phytosanitary Certificate.



On arrival of the consignment, it will be examined and will only be released if found to be free from injurious pests, otherwise it may be fumigated or otherwise treated as deemed necessary by the examining Plant Quarantine Officer stationed at CHITTAGONG SEAPORT, or may be returned to the consignor, or may be seized and destroyed following the Plant Quarantine Act, 2011, if not complying with the import conditions. All relevant expenses for such treatment will be borne by the importer.
4. Additional conditions to be stated on the Phytosanitary Certificate :
  1. The Phytosanitary Certificate should have additional declaration that the consignments have been fumigated with appropriate fumigant at recommended dose before shipment.
  2. The Consignment Should be free from all Kinds of Inert Materials and quarantine weed seed, and also free from :
    - a. Granary weevil.
    - b. Canary grass.
    - c. Grain beetle.
    - d. Bunt of wheat.
    - e. Ergot.
  3. The import permit (IP) number shall be quoted in the Phytosanitary Certificate.
