Beans and Pulses Monthly Report February 2012

Report Highlights:

Burma exported 141,008 metric tons (MT) of beans and pulses in February, an increase of 61 percent from the same period in 2011. Of this total 61 percent went to India or 86,537 MT, followed by Singapore with 13 percent or 17,963 MT, and Vietnam eight percent or 11,675 MT. Additionally, seven percent of the total mung bean exports or 3,629 MT were traded with China with 3476 MT and Thailand 153 MT through border trade.

General Information:

Trade

Burma's beans and pulses exports in February, 2012 totaled 141,008 MT, up 61 percent from 87,418 MT in February 2011. Mung bean accounted for 36 percent of the total exports, followed by toor whole 33 percent and matpe (black gram) 24 percent. India and Singapore were the largest buyers accounting for 86,537 MT or 61 percent and 17,963 MT or 13 percent of total exports, respectively. Additionally, seven percent of the total mung bean exports or 3,629 MT were traded with China 3,476 MT and Thailand 143 MT through border trades.

Export prospects

Beans and pulses are currently being harvested and are expected to peak from May to September. It is expected that total production this year will be 4.7 MMT a 6 percent increase from 2011.Month to month exports of beans and pulses increased 61 percent from 87,418MT in 2011 to 141,008 MT in 2012 due to strong demand from China and India. On the other hand, farmers have shifted their cultivation preference to beans and pulses from rice during the summer season, as these have generated higher returns.
