Report Highlights:

Weekly report as of December 11, 2020, of COVID-19 impact on Indian port operations.

India Port Situation Update as of Friday, December 11, 2020



Note: Each featured port includes air freight imports arriving at that city.

1. Mumbai: According to the All India Port Association, Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust (JNPT) cargo volume dropped 15 percent during April-November to 38.36 million metric tons (MMT), compared to 45.07 MMT during the same period last year. Mumbai Port Trust cargo volume dropped 19 percent during April-November to 33.28 MMT, compared to 40.92 MMT during the same period last year. Overall, trade volumes for India's top 12 state-run ports fell 11 percent during April-November to nearly 414.30 MMT, compared to 463.05 MMT during the same period last year.

2. Mundra: No update available.

3. Tuticorin: V.O. Chidambaranar Port Trust cargo volume dropped 12 percent during April-November to 21.2 million tons, compared to 24.08 MMT during the same period last year.

4. Kandla: Deendayal Port Trust cargo volume dropped ten percent during April-November to 73.86 million tons, compared to 82.21 MMT during the same period last year.

5. Chennai: Chennai Port Trust cargo volume dropped 20 percent during April-November to 25.80 million tons, compared to 32.14 MMT during the same period last year.

6. Mangalore: New Mangalore Port Trust cargo volume dropped eight percent during April-November to 22.33 million tons, compared to 24.18 MMT during the same period last year.

7. Kolkata: Syama Prasad Mukherjee Port Trust cargo volume dropped ten percent during April-November to 37.13 million tons, compared to 41.09 MMT during the same period last year.

8. Cochin: Cochin Port Trust cargo volume dropped 18 percent during April-November to 18.2 million tons, compared to 22.11 MMT during the same period last year. Cochin Port Trust has experienced greater cargo traffic in the past few weeks due to ongoing congestion at nearby Colombo Port in Sri Lanka.
