# **Dairy Regulation Revision**

### **Report Highlights:**

The Ministry of Agriculture (MOA) recently further revised a regulation that had required local dairy processors and dairy product importers to form partnerships with local dairy producers. This most recent revision eliminates all language making the partnerships compulsory, deletes previously required reporting requirements, and removes all remaining sanctions associated with non-compliance. Meanwhile, MOA has stated publicly that they will continue to "encourage" the dairy partnerships.

### **General Information:**

In a regulation (33/2018) dated July 30, 2018, the Ministry of Agriculture (MOA) again revised regulation 26/2017 on Milk Supply and Distribution. Regulation 26/2017 (see ID1722) had mandated that importers establish "partnership agreements" with local entities to procure local milk, invest in local milk production, and/or invest in promoting local fluid milk consumption. MOA issued its first revision (30/2018) to 26/2017 on July 20 (see ID1822), but that revision retained a section on sanctions for failing to comply with the partnership requirement and also still included some language that could be interpreted that the partnerships were still required for domestic processors. This second revision eliminates any notion that the partnership agreements are compulsory, deletes mandatory reporting requirements, removes all remaining sanctions associated with non-compliance, and deletes the clause stating that dairy processors must within three years establish their own plants that only procure milk locally.

In response to a backlash of criticism from domestic producer organizations for rescinding the local purchase and promotion mandate, MOA has stated publicly that they will continue to "encourage' dairy processors to form partnerships to buy local milk, invest in dairy production, and to promote local fluid milk consumption. Meanwhile, the local dairy processors association stated that while it is no longer mandatory, they will continue to buy milk from local dairy producers, just as they did long before 26/2017 required it.

MOA reports that 88 dairy product importers and 30 domestic processors have already submitted partnership plans. However, according to the revised regulations, companies will not be punished for not submitting a partnership plan, nor will the existence of importers' partnership plans be considered when MOA decides whether to issue import recommendations.

Nonetheless, importers are still concerned that while officially no longer required, MOA still has an implicit requirement that importers must demonstrate that they are doing something to promote the local industry as a condition for obtaining a permit to import dairy products. In public discussions to clarify the revised requirements, MOA said they will "still encourage partnerships through other substitute regulations."

### Considers:

- a. that by the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution, as amended by the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 30/Permentan/PK.450/7/2018 regarding the Amendment of the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution, partnerships between businesses and farmers, farmers group association, and/or cooperatives has been regulated;
- b. that in order to create business opportunities and conducive investment climate, amendment of the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution, as amended by the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 30/Permentan/PK.450/7/2018 regarding the Amendment of the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution is needed;
- c. that based on the considerations referred to in letters a and b, establishment of the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture regarding The Second Amendment of the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution is needed;

#### DECIDES

To establish:

THE REGULATION OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE REGARDING THE SECOND AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATION OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE NUMBER 26/PERMENTAN/PK.450/7/2017 REGARDING MILK SUPPLY AND DISTRIBUTION

### Article I

Several provisions in the Regulation of Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution (State Gazette Year 2017 Number 995), as amended by the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 30/Permentan/PK.450/7/2018 regarding the Amendment of the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture Number 26/Permentan/PK.450/7/2017 regarding Milk Supply and Distribution (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Year 2018 Number 931), are amended as follow:

1. Provision of paragraph (2) of Article 24 is amended, thus Article 24 reads as follow:

### Article 24

- (1) Partnerships through using SSDN [domestic fresh milk], as referred to in Article 23, shall be conducted by Businesses that produce processed milk.
- (2) Businesses producing processed milk, as referred to in paragraph (1), shall produce the processed milk in their own milk processing unit or in cooperation (*toll manufacturing*) with Businesses who already own milk processing units.

(Originally in Reg. Min. Ag. 30/2018, paragraph (2) of this article reads:

- (2) Businesses producing processed milk, as referred to in paragraph (1), are obliged to produce the processed milk in their own milk processing unit or in cooperation (toll manufacturing) with Businesses who already own milk processing units.)
- 2. Article 37 is amended to read as follows:

#### Article 37

- (1) Farmers, Cooperatives and Businesses in conducting milk supply and distribution activities shall submit production and distribution reports to the Head of the Regional Services Office [Head of Dinas] in accordance with their authority.
- (2) The Head of Dinas, as referred to in paragraph (1) shall submit report to the Minister through the Director General of Livestock and Animal Health Services with a copy to the Minister of Cooperatives and Small and Medium Enterprises, Minister of Industry, and Minister of Trade.
- (3) Reporting, as referred to in paragraph (1), shall be performed at least once every 3 (three) months after the activities of Milk Supply and Distribution.
- (4) Reporting, as referred to in paragraph (2), shall be submitted online or through email, in accordance with Format.

(Originally in Reg. Min. Ag. 26/2017, this article reads:

- (1) Farmers, Cooperatives and Businesses in conducting milk supply and distribution activities are obliged to submit production and distribution reports to the Head of the Regional Services Office [Head of Dinas] in accordance with their authority.
- (2) The Head of Dinas, as referred to in paragraph (1) is obliged to submit report to the Minister through the Director General of Livestock and Animal Health Services with a copy to the Minister of Cooperatives and Small and Medium Enterprises, Minister of Industry, and Minister of Trade.
- (3) Reporting, as referred to in paragraph (1), shall be performed at least once every 3 (three) months after the activities of Milk Supply and Distribution.
- (4) Reporting, as referred to in paragraph (2), shall be submitted online or through email, in accordance with Format.)
- 3. Article 44 is removed.

(Originally in Reg. Min. Ag. 30/2018, this article reads:

(1) Businesses that violate the provisions referred to in Article 24 paragraph (2), and/or Article

*37 paragraph (1) shall receive administrative sanctions in the form of:* 

- a. written warning;
- b. temporary suspension from Milk Supply and Distribution activities;
- c. business license revoked.
- (2) The imposition of sanctions as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a through c shall be conducted by Minister or governor, Head of District/Mayor in accordance to their respective authorities.
- (3) Sanction in the form of business license revocation, as referred to in paragraph (1) letter d, shall be proposed by the Minister to the business licensor.)

### 4. Article 45 is removed.

(Originally in Reg. Min. Ag. 26/2017, this article reads: Provision as referred to in Article 24 paragraph (2) shall come into force after 3 (three) years since the promulgation date of this Ministerial Regulation)

### CHAPTER II

This Ministerial Regulation shall enter into force on the date of its promulgation.

In order to be publicly acknowledged, order the enactment of this Ministerial Regulation by establishing it in the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia
