**Report Highlights:**

The General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC) recently made updates at the end of September 2022 to the list of products subject to Decree 248, removing 100 and adding 148. An updated spreadsheet of the products subject to Decree 248 is attached. Sorghum has been removed from the product list and additions include some infant foods, dried mushrooms, pine nuts, spices, and dairy products. Exporters should insure that their facilities are properly registered with GACC before shipping to China.

## **GACC Revises the Scope of Decree 248:**

The General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC) made several small revisions to the list of products within the scope of Decree 248 over the last several months. GACC made more numerous changes during August and September 2022. This report is the first FAS published GAIN report of products covered under the scope of Decree 248 since the report update published on March 4, 2022.

GACC does not announce the changes and it is likely that additional revisions will continue to be made to the list. While FAS China plans to publish updates when GACC makes significant revisions, exporters should periodically run a “Product Type Query” on GACC’s Single Window system to determine if their facilities need to register.

Exporters should not export a product to China unless their facilities are properly registered for that product. Exporters are encouraged to review the attached spreadsheet to determine if their products are within the scope of Decree 248.

The spreadsheet contains three tabs: one for the current list as of September 29, 2022, another for recently removed products, and one for recently added products. The last production facility in the production chain needs to be registered with GACC if its products will be shipped to China and are within the scope of Decree 248. There are also registration requirements for cold storage facilities.

FAS China has published several reports on Decrees 248 and 249 to inform and educate U.S. food and agricultural stakeholders over the last few years. The two reports listed below are the most recent.
