## **Report Highlights:**


On June 27, 2024, the Egyptian Ministry of Trade and Industry signed Decree No. 361/2024. The Decree extended the shelf-life validity period for imported frozen beef liver from seven to twelve months and for frozen fish from six to ten months. The decree is valid for six months, as of July 1, 2024, and expires on December 31, 2024.

## **General Information**

The Egyptian Ministry of Trade and Industry signed Decree No. 361/2024 on June 27, 2024 (see Attachments). The decree extended the shelf-life validity period for imported frozen beef liver from seven to twelve months and for frozen fish from six to ten months. The decree is valid for six months, as of July 1, 2024, and expires on December 31, 2024.

## **Egyptian Market**

Egypt, with a cuisine that utilizes beef liver in a variety of ways, is the largest export market for U.S. frozen beef livers -- valued at \$53 million in calendar year 2023. However, the market is relatively small for U.S. frozen fish exports – valued at roughly \$20,000 in calendar year 2023.
