# **Ethiopia's Ag Imports Continue Growing**

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#### **Report Highlights:**

Ethiopia's agriculture imports reached \$1.8 billion in 2015. Future imports are expected to increase as the country's economy and population continue to grow at a faster pace than local production capacity. Presently, commercial imports of U.S. agricultural products (excluding food aid) range from \$30-40 million each year. By comparison, Ethiopia's agricultural exports to the United States appear to have reached a record of nearly \$160 million in 2015.

#### Ethiopia's Ag Imports Projected to Keep Growing:

According to official Ethiopian trade statistics, imports of agricultural products have grown from just over \$1 billion in 2010 to nearly \$1.8 billion in 2015. Similarly, over this same period, imports by volume increased from 1.9 million to 3 million metric tons.

As the country's economy continues to steam ahead and as the population grows from its current level of nearly 100 million inhabitants, imports of agricultural products are expected to continue growing as demand outpaces local production capacity. This anticipated growth, however, will be moderated somewhat due to anticipated increases in local agricultural production and the private sectors' difficulty in accessing sufficient amounts of foreign exchange.

The country's foreign exchange reserves were recently estimated at less than two months of import coverage, below the IMF recommended minimum of three months. Therefore, if Ethiopia is to meet the expected increase in demand for certain agricultural imports, it will need to, among other things, increase its exports (e.g. agriculture and floriculture products, textiles and apparel, leather and leather products, and electricity, etc.).

### Ag Imports Growing, Especially Wheat, Sugar, and Palm Oil:

Similar to the economic development trends of other countries, as Ethiopian consumers' incomes have grown, the demand for cooking oil, sugar, livestock protein (e.g. meat, milk and eggs), wheat-based products (e.g. pasta, cookies, and biscuits), and convenience foods is increasing.

Of these products, palm oil, sugar and sweeteners, and wheat were the three largest agriculture imports by value in 2015. From 2010-2015, imports of palm oil doubled to nearly \$425 million, wheat imports climbed 20 percent to a little more than \$360 million, while imports of sugar and sweeteners grew 65 percent to almost \$180 million. It should be noted that the Government of Ethiopia (GoE) intends to increase local production of wheat and sugar to reduce and eventually eliminate imports of these products. However, given local demand requirements and existing capacity constraints, post expects imports of these (and other) products to continue for the foreseeable future.

In addition, imports of rice, prepared foods, distilled spirits, pasta, and vegetable oil, among others showed significant growth as consumers' diets are changing. For example, over the six-year period from 2010-15, rice imports increased six fold to almost \$158 million, prepared food imports quadruped to \$126 million, distilled spirt imports doubled to almost \$20 million, pasta imports increased seven fold to \$38 million. #### Current U.S. Ag Sales to Ethiopia:

According to Ethiopian trade statistics, commercial imports (excluding food aid) of U.S. agricultural products range between \$30-40 million each year. Roughly two-thirds of these products are first passing through Dubai, UAE before being forwarded to Ethiopia in a mixed container. According to

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> A significant amount of the U.S. ag products reaching Ethiopia are first shipped to the UAE and then forwarded to Ethiopia in a mixed container. These indirect shipments do not show up in U.S. trade statistics as product destined for Ethiopia. However, with the help of Ethiopian trade statistics, which identifies the products' original country of origin, both the volume and value of most of these indirect shipments can be calculated.

ERCA import statistics, the leading U.S. items being sold commercially include malt extract (\$14.4m), maize flour/groats (\$3.4m), snack foods (\$1.7m), protein concentrates (\$1.5m), planting seeds (\$1.4m), hop extract (\$0.7m), fresh fruit, mostly apples (\$0.3m), and fruit and vegetable juices (\$0.3m), condiments and sauces (\$0.3m), distilled spirits (\$0.2m), forest products (\$0.2m). By comparison, Ethiopia shipped nearly \$160 million (FOB value), which appears to be a record, of agricultural products to the United States in 2015. Major exports were coffee (\$121m), oilseeds (\$21m), horticulture products (\$5m), prepared foods (\$4.9m) of which most is injera, processed vegetables (\$1.5m), pulses (\$1.2m), and spices (\$0.7m).
