Background: Rule 2.4.2 (7) of the Food Safety and standards Rules, 2011 states:

"The manuals of the method of analysis, as amended/adopted by the Authority from time to time including AOAC/ ISO/Pearson's/Jacob/IUPAC/Food Chemicals CODEX/BIS/Woodmen/Winton-Winton/Joslyn, shall be used for analyzing the samples of food articles. However, in case the method for analyzing any parameter is not available in these manuals, a validated method of analysis prescribed by internationally recognized/analytical/regulatory agencies shall be adopted."
