# **India Amends Guidelines for White Leg Shrimp Imports**

### **Report Highlights:**

On June 19, 2012, the Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India amended guidelines regulating quarantine for the import of Litopenaeus vannamei (White Leg Shrimp). Under the amendment, Indian imports of Litopenaeus vannamei brood stock will no longer be subject to a pre-quarantine test for *Baculovirus penaei*. The amendment has not yet been notified to the World Trade Organization.

#### **General Information:**

**Introduction:** On June 19, 2012, the Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India amended guidelines regulating quarantine for the import of Litopenaeus vannamei (White Leg Shrimp). Under the amendment, Indian imports of Litopenaeus vannamei brood stock will no longer be subject to a prequarantine test for *Baculovirus penaei*. The original guidelines on Litopenaeus vannamei imports were issued on October 15, 2008 (see GAIN IN8132). The amendment has not yet been notified to the World Trade Organization.

New Delhi, the 19th June, 2012

S.O. 1392(E).—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 and section 3A of the Live-stock Importation Act, 1898 (9 of 1898), the Central Government hereby makes the following amendments in the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Agriculture (Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries) published vide number S.O. 2482(E), dated the 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2008, in Part II, section 3, sub-section (ii) of the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, dated the 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2008, namely:-

In the said notification, in the Schedule, in paragraph 3.0, in item one,-

under the third point, the entry at Sl. No. 5. 'Baculovirus penaei (BP) (OIE listed)' shall be deleted and consequently, the third point shall be read as:

- "A certificate indicating that the batch of exported broodstock was held in prequarantine for a period of 12 days and the results of the tests for the following pathogens should be included.
- 1. Taura syndrome virus (TSV) (OIE listed)
- 2. Yellowhead virus (YHV) (OIE listed)
- 3. Infectious myonecrosis virus (IMNV) (OIE listed)
- 4. Infectious Hypodermal and Haematopoietic Necrosis Virus (IHHNV) (OIE listed)
- 5. White spot syndrome virus (WSSV) (OIE listed)
- Necrotising hepatopancreatitis bacterium α-Proteobacterium (NHPB)<sup>1</sup>".
