Mexico Announces Maximum Sugar Export Quota to the United States

Report Highlights:

On February 11, 2015, the Secretariat of Economy (SE) published in the *Diario Oficial* (Federal Register), an announcement containing the maximum export quota of Mexican sugar to the United States for the sugar cycle October 2014-September 2015.

General Information:

Introduction: This report summarizes an announcement published in Mexico's *Diario Oficial* (Federal Register) on February 11, 2015 by the Secretariat of Economy (SE). The announcement establishes the maximum quota of Mexican sugar to be exported to the United States for the sugar cycle October 2014-September 2015.

Title: Notification where the Maximum Quota Allotment of Sugar to be Exported to the United States is Announced.

Executive Summary:

On February 6, 2015, (please see GAIN report #MX5006) the SE published in the *Diario Oficial* (Federal Register) the guidelines to request and receive sugar export licenses. On February 11, 2015, SE announced via the *Diario Oficial* the amount of the total quota of Mexican sugar derived from sugar cane or beets to be exported to the United States from October 2014-September 2015. The amount in metric tons raw value is 1,162,604.75

This calculation was determined in compliance with Point 13 of the February 6, 2015 notification. For this present cycle, information from the December 2014 World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Mexico's National Committee for the Sustainable Development of Sugar Cane (CONADESUCA) was considered.
