Despite an outlook of smaller second-crop rice production in Thailand and prevailing inactive export demand, the news of the government tender of 569,116 metric tons (204,998 metric tons for food, and 364,118 metric tons for non-food use) weighed heavily on Thai rice export prices, with prices for most grades declining marginally this week.

Thirty four eligible companies reportedly joined the bidding for 204,998 metric tons of food-grade rice on February 16. Sources reported that the bidding was active due mainly to anticipated smaller second-crop rice supplies. Seventeen bidders are reportedly for another tender of 364,118 metric tons of non-food grade rice for industrial uses and animal feed which will take place on February 17.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for February 8-14, 2016 totaled 132,703 metric tons, up 84,695 metric tons from the previous week and 40,159 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 92,544 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – February 14, 2016 totaled 532,658 metric tons, up 24.5 percent from the previous week.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
