Export prices of all grades of rice decreased 1-3 percent from the previous week as the Thai baht depreciated to 36.53 baht/\$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 36.15 baht/\$1.00. Rice exporters are currently securing supplies of parboiled rice to fulfill contracted shipments of parboiled rice exports to African and ASEAN countries. In addition, rice millers expect that abundant precipitation could increase supplies of MY2022/23 main crop rice even though farmers are likely to apply less fertilizer due to higher prices of fertilizer and other inputs.

## Rice Export Update

Total weekly rice exports for the week of July 4 – July 10 were unavailable at the time of publishing due to the 3-day Thai holiday last week. The following is repeated information from last week's report. Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for June 27 – July 3, 2022, totaled 117,711 metric tons, down 38,431 metric tons from the previous week and down 11,033 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 128,744 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – July 3, 2022, totaled 2,919,172 metric tons, up 74 percent from the same period last year.

**Note on data:** Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
