Report Highlights:

Rice export prices further dropped 2-6 percent from the previous week despite a strengthening of the Thai baht to a 19-month high.

Rice export prices for most grades of Thai white rice dropped 2-6 percent from the previous week. Foreign buyers are reportedly waiting for the new Indonesia's tender to import 450,000 MT of 5% grade white rice for October-November delivery. Meanwhile, the Thai baht appreciated to a 19-month high of \$1.00=32.81 baht from the previous week's exchange rate of \$1.00=33.06 baht. Exporters reportedly expressed concern over the strengthening of the Thai baht as the exchange rate volatility would affect the competitiveness of Thai rice exports.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperative closely monitored heavy rains, which led to flash floods and landslides since mid-July 2024, and reported on September 23, 2024, that 880,098 rai (140,816 hectares) of MY 2024/25 main-crop rice acreage, mostly along the river basins in the northern and northeastern regions, were impacted by the heavy rains.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for September 9-15, 2024, totaled 153,096 metric tons down 6,139 metric tons from the previous week and down 18,408 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 171,504 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to September 15, 2024, totaled 5,982,995 metric tons, up 35 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
