TH6091 – Export prices continued to decline 5 to 6 percent due to competition from Vietnamese rice and the anticipated sales of government's rice stock tenders for 1 million metric tons which will be issued on August 29-30.

Export prices for most grades of rice declined 5 to 6 percent due to competition from Vietnamese rice which is reportedly \$50/MT cheaper as its new-crop supplies are entering the market. Also, traders are awaiting the government's upcoming rice stock tenders of around 1 million metric tons which will be issued on August 29-30, 2016. The tenders will consist of 755,572 metric tons of 5% grade white rice (food grade for domestic and export markets) and 255,796 metric tons of broken white rice (A1 Super grade for industrial uses) which are carry-over stocks from the MY2012/13 and MY2013/14 pledging programs. Presently, export prices of old-crop 5% grade white rice is at \$332/MT which is 10 percent cheaper than those of current-crop white rice.

The government reported that it is holding rice stocks of around 9 million metric tons of which 40 percent is industrial grade rice and the remainder is food grade rice. The government announced that they plan to completely sell off its old rice stocks during 2017. The government also stated that new tenders during September–December 2016 will mainly be for industrial uses in order to prevent domestic rice prices from falling during the harvest period in the last quarter of this year.

#### **Rice Export Update**

Unofficial preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for August 15-21, 2016 totaled 78,411 metric tons, up 27,575 metric tons from the previous week and up 10,137 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 68,274 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1–August 21, 2016 totaled 2,241,116 metric tons, down 13 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the That Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thatland. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
