Export price remained unchanged from the previous week. Reportedly, on November 11, 2014 the Government will likely again consider implementation of a new on-farm pleading program for MY2014/15 main-crop fragrant and glutinous rice in the northern and northeastern regions (for more detail of the program please see TH4104, Grain and Feed Update – October 2014). The final approval of the program was postponed from the previous week due to ongoing discussions about the financial costs of the proposed program.

As of Monday, November 10, farm-gate prices are under downward pressure because harvest is peaking. Prices of fragrant rice paddy are at 12,825 baht per metric tons (\$400/MT), down 18 percent from the same period last year. Also, prices of glutinous rice paddy declined 28 percent to 9,200 baht per metric tons (\$288/MT). If the government announces a new pledging scheme, farmers will likely participate due to attractive intervention prices (including the storage cost subsidy) which will be at today's prices 20 percent above the market prices for fragrant rice paddy, and 38 percent for glutinous rice paddy.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for November 3-9, 2014 totaled 58,975 metric tons, down 46,629 metric tons from the previous week and down 41,455 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 100,430 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – November 9, 2014, totaled 4,526,962 metric tons, up 62 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the That Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FASBKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thatland. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
