Report Highlights:

Rice export prices increased by 2-4 percent due to strong demand for low-grade white rice from African countries. The government is expected to sell the remaining 2.04 million metric tons of rice stocks by October 2018.

Export prices for all grades of rice increased by 2-4 percent from the previous week driven by strong demand for low-grade white rice from African countries. Meanwhile, the government is planning to issue a new tender for the remaining 44,000 metric tons of food-quality rice stocks in late April – May 2018. According to the National Rice Policy and Management Committee meeting on March 29, 2018, the government is holding 2.04 million metric tons of old-crop rice stocks which consist of (1) 1.5 million metric tons of feed-quality rice, (2) 0.5 million metric tons of deteriorated rice, and (3) 0.04 million metric tons of food-quality rice. The government expects to sell all of these remaining rice stocks by October 2018, with the food-quality rice stocks being sold in late April or May and the other rice stocks being sold from June - September 2018.

The Thai Rice Exporter Association reported that Thai rice exports during January - February 2018 totaled 1,912,620 metric tons, up 10 percent from the same period last year. Rice exports in February were 950,761 metric tons, 4 percent increase from the same period last year, but smaller than the 17 percent increase in January 2018, compared to the previous year. This suggests that the strong export momentum of 2017 is slowing down.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for March 19-25, 2018, totaled 166,034 metric tons, down 69,479 metric tons from the previous week and down 17,953 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 183,987 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1- March 25, 2018, totaled 2,286,490 metric tons.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, during May 1, 2013 - December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% - 100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FASBKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
