Report Highlights:

Export prices further increased 1-2 percent due to the strengthening of the Thai baht. The government is expected to sell 1.7 million metric tons of food-quality rice stocks and 0.5 million metric tons of deteriorated rice stocks next week.

Export prices further increased 1-2 percent mainly due to the strengthening of the Thai baht to 33.9 baht/USD, compared to 34.4 baht/USD in the previous week. The government received 58 bids totaling 1.7 million metric tons in response to the tender for the last remaining food-quality rice stocks of 1.8 million metric tons issued on May 24, 2017. The bids consisted of approximately 1.4 million metric tons of fragrant rice, 0.2 million metric tons of white rice, and 0.1 million metric tons of broken rice and glutinous rice. The government is expected to finalize the sale of 1.7 million metric tons of food-quality rice stocks next week, together with the sale of 0.5 million metric tons of deteriorated rice stocks to ethanol producers from the one million metric ton tender issued on April 28, 2017. If both sales are finalized, the government rice stocks are expected to decline to approximately 2.9 million metric tons which consist of 0.1 million metric tons of foodquality rice, 2.2 million metric tons of feed-quality rice stocks, and 0.6 million metric tons of deteriorated rice.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for May 15-21, 2017, totaled 178,401 metric tons, down 24,234 metric tons from the previous week, and down 7,941 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 186,342 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 - May 21, 2017 totaled 3,334,380 metric tons.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, during May 1, 2013 - December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% - 100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FASBKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
