Report Highlights:

Rice export prices increased 1 percent due mainly to demand for white rice from the Philippines. The government will issue a new tender for the remaining food-quality rice on May 18, 2018.

Despite the weakening of the Thai baht from 31.39 baht/U.S. \$1.00 to 31.72 baht/U.S. \$1.00 this week, export prices for most grades of rice increased 1 percent due mainly to the demand for white rice from the Philippine government. The Ministry of Commerce reported that the Philippine government decided to purchase 120,000 metric tons of Thai 25% grade white rice at U.S. \$517.50 per metric ton (MT) in its tender for 250,000 metric tons of white rice on May 4, 2018. Additionally, the Philippine government purchased 80,000 metric tons of Vietnamese 25% grade white rice at U.S. \$517.50/MT and 50,000 metric tons of Vietnamese 15% grade white rice at U.S. \$526.50/MT. The shipment will take place in May until June 15, 2018.

The government will issue a new tender for the remaining 43,725 metric tons of food-quality rice on May 18, 2018. Additionally, the government plans to conduct another tender for the remaining 1.5 million metric tons of feed-quality rice and 0.5 million metric tons of deteriorated rice in June 2018.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for April 23-29, 2018, totaled 173,330 metric tons, up 51,459 metric tons from the previous week and up 48,866 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 124,464 metric tons (Table 2.1). Rice exports from January 1 – April 29, 2018 totaled 3,087,655 metric tons.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, during May 1, 2013 - December 18, 2016, export data and not include 25% - 100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
