Export prices for white rice increased 2 to 4 percent from the previous week due to limited supplies. Some exporters are still not providing quotations and may not do so until the government begins to sell its rice stocks. Meanwhile, export prices for parboiled rice declined around 3 percent from the previous week due to lower demand from the Middle East.

As of June 29, 2014, the government reportedly received approximately 11.7 million metric tons of main-crop rice paddy (7.7 million metric milled equivalent – Table 2) under the MY2013/14 Main-Crop Rice Paddy Pledging Program at a cost of around 193 billion baht (\$6 billion). As of June 26, 2014, the BAAC has reportedly paid approximately 192 billion baht (\$5.9 billion) in loans to 1.5 million rice farmers for 11.6 million metric tons of pledges (7.6 million metric tons milled equivalent).

On June 24, 2014 the military government approved a 4.7 billion baht (\$145 million) budget to fund the MY2014/15 Rice Famer Assistance Program. The budget will be mainly allocated for input subsidies and soft loans that the government will subsidize through the BAAC. Farmers will be eligible to apply for six-month loans with 3% interest rates through the program compared to 7% in the open market. Each farmer will be eligible for up to 50,000 baht.

Rice Export Update

Preliminary unofficial rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for June 23-29, 2014 totaled 130,326 metric tons, up 23,773 metric tons from the previous week and up 7,546 metric tons from the four- week moving average of 122,781 metric tons (Table 3). Rice exports from January 1 – June 29, 2014 totaled 2,271,006 metric tons, up 33 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the That Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FASBKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thatland. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
