TH4062 – Export prices increased 1 to 2 percent due to the strengthening of the Thai baht and white rice supplies remain tight.

Export prices increased 1 to 2 percent from the previous week due to the strengthening of the Thai baht (31.7 baht/US\$ compared to 32.1 baht/US\$ in the previous week). Meanwhile, supplies of white rice remain tight as the military government still has a hold on the movement of government-owned rice stocks while they continue inspections of storage facilities.

As of July 20, 2014, the government reportedly received approximately 11.7 million metric tons of main-crop rice paddy (7.7 million metric milled equivalent – Table 2) under the MY2013/14 Main-Crop Rice Paddy Pledging Program at a cost of around 193 billion baht (\$6 billion). As of July 17, 2014, the BAAC has reportedly paid approximately 192 billion baht (\$5.9 billion) in loans to 1.5 million rice farmers for 11.6 million metric tons of pledges (7.6 million metric tons milled equivalent).

Rice Export Update

Unofficial rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for July 14-20, 2014 totaled

140,706 metric tons, up 20,974 metric tons from the previous week and up 14,010 metric tons from the four- week moving average of 126,696 metric tons (Table 3). Rice exports from January 1 – July 20, 2014 totaled 2,649,129 metric tons, up 45 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the That Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FASBKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
