Export prices declined about 1 percent from the previous week due to sales of government rice stocks. The Rice Policy and Management Committee approved the sale of 755,012 metric tons from total tenders of 1,009,368 metric tons (753,572 metric tons of food-grade rice and 255,796 metric tons of non-food grade rice) which were issued on August 29–30, 2016. The sales consisted of 702,615 metric tons of food-grade rice (5% grade white rice mainly for export) and 52,397 metric tons of non-food grade rice (broken rice mainly for feed use). The average prices were approximately 9,840 baht/MT (\$285/MT) for food-grade rice and 5,480 baht/MT (\$159/MT) for non-food grade rice. This is cheaper than market prices of current crop rice by 10 percent and 20 percent, respectively.

Since January 2016, the government has sold approximately 3.9 million metric tons from total tenders of 9.3 million metric tons. These sales consist of 3.5 million metric tons of food-grade rice, mainly for exports, and 0.4 million metric tons of non-food grade rice, mainly for feed use. Presently, the government is still holding rice stocks of around 8.4 million metric tons.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for September 5-11, 2016 totaled 105,307 metric tons, up 6,184 metric tons from the previous week and up 4,481 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 100,826 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – September 11, 2016 totaled 2,598,866 metric tons, down 11 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the That Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thatland. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
