Report Highlights:

Final official estimates for MY10/11 wheat planted area is 480,000 MT, for 90,000 HA or about 16 percent smaller than in MY09/10. For the first three months of MY09/10, Serbia is continuing to have large corn exports and total corn exports for period October-December 2009 is 561,241 MT.

General Information:

Wheat

Planting of new wheat crop in Serbia has been hampered by unfavorable weather conditions and large unsold wheat stocks. Although the optimal time for seeding the wheat crop in Serbia is between the first week of October and the first week of November, in this period only 60 percent of wheat was planted. Heavy October rains and wet fields have delayed the completion of wheat seeding in various

parts of Serbia and in some areas planting lasted even until mid-December. Final official estimates for MY10/11 wheat planted area is 480,000 MT, for 90,000 HA or about 16 percent smaller than in MY09/10. This is the smallest area sown to wheat crop for the last three years. Last time wheat planting of 488,000 HA was in MY07/08. Fort the autumn planting Serbian Government was subsiding 100,000 MT of mineral fertilizers with 10,000 dinars/MT (150 USD/MT) or about 30 percent of the price. From January 1, 2010, Serbian Government started to subsidize additional quantity of 300,000 MT of imported mineral fertilizers with 5,000 dinars/MT (75 USD/MT) that will be sold until February 12, 2010 through Novi Sad Commodity Exchange.

Even with law wheat planted area, Serbia will have enough wheat for its own needs and for exports. Ending stocks of MY09/10 were 460,000 MT, but due to law quality most of the wheat is exported for the cattle feed. It is estimated that in MY10/11 export of wheat will be around 250,000 MT mostly as cattle feed. In MY09/10, 206,804 MT of wheat was exported majority to neighboring countries.

Currently, wheat is sold at Novi Sad Commodity Exchange for 11.30 dinars/kg (USD167/MT), while wheat flour price is 18 dinars/kg (269 USD/MT).

Corn

Serbia is one of the Europe's largest corn producers and in MY08/09 entered a list of the top ten corn exporters in the world. Serbian corn exports for the MY08/09 were 1.46 million MT, valued at 160 million EUR (234 million USD). In MY09/10 Serbia continued to have large corn exports for the last three months of CY2009.

Total corn export for MY09/10 is estimated to be 2 million MT, even higher than in MY08/09. This can be estimated if Serbia continues to have monthly corn exports at the level of the first three months of the MY09/10. Most of the corn exports from Serbia go to Montenegro, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Albania, Greece, Cyprus, Italy, Spain and Portugal.

Current corn price at Novi Sad Commodity Exchange is 11 dinars/kg (USD164/MT).

Barley

This fall winter barley for MY10/11 was planted on 68,000 HA, for 8,000 HA or 11 percent less than in MY09/10. It is estimated that some 60,000 HA of additional barley will be planted in spring 2010. Current price of barley at Novi Sad Commodity Exchange is 8.7 dinars/kg (130 USD/MT).
