Weekly Rice Price Update

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Report Highlights:

TH1016 Domestic and export prices increased 1-3 percent due to tight exportable supplies and strengthening of the Thai baht to 30.47 baht/\$. Prices are unlikely to increase much more because exporters have already secured their allotments from the government stock release to cover contracted exports of white rice to African countries and Indonesia.

Domestic and export prices increased 1-3 percent due to tight exportable supplies and strengthening of the Thai baht to 30.47 baht/\$, compared to 30.90 baht/\$ in the previous week. After the long Lunar New Year holiday last week, rice millers and traders resumed their business with higher offer prices in anticipation of tighter exportable supplies while exporters are fulfilling outstanding contracts of 100% grade white rice to Iran and 5% grade white rice to African countries and Indonesia. Prices are unlikely to increase much more because exporters have already secured their allotments from the government stock release. In addition, Vietnamese white rice was offered \$40/MT lower than Thai white rice, as compared to typically \$30-35/MT difference, after the Indonesia government finalized its 820,000-ton white rice contract with Thai rice exporters last week. Meanwhile, the National Rice Committee agreed on January 31, 2011 to more aggressively implement its Direct Purchase Program with a new target of 2.0 million tons of paddy at benchmark prices. The enhanced program is an additional measure to help stabilize domestic prices. Last year, the program bought only around 150,000 tons as market prices were higher than benchmark prices.

The government's weekly benchmark price for white rice for February 7-13, 2011 declined 0.7 percent.



Rice Export Update

Unofficial rice exports (excluding fragrant rice) for January 31 – February 6, 2011 totaled 197,142 tons, up 30,361 tons from the previous week, and up 11,670 tons from the four week moving average of 185,472 tons. Exports of white rice and parboiled rice during January 1 – February 6, 2011 totaled 932,411 tons, up 50.4 percent from 620,025 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during January 1 – February 3, 2011 amounted to 994,244 tons, up 23.3 percent from 806,103 tons in the previous year.
