## **Weekly Rice Price Update**

#### **Report Highlights:**

TH0116 Despite steady domestic prices, export prices increased slightly by 1.0 percent as the Thai baht strengthened against the U.S. dollar. Exporters encouraged the Government to release the intervention stocks on a weekly basis of 50,000 tons until stocks are depleted in order to minimize the impact on domestic prices.



Despite steady domestic prices, export prices increased slightly by 1.0 percent as the Thai baht strengthened against the U.S. dollar from around 32.0 baht/\$ in the previous week to 31.7 baht/\$. Meanwhile, foreign traders are still waiting for the Thai government to release details on the rice stock release which is likely to be within this month, as such new orders have been slow coming in. Exporters encouraged the Government to release the intervention stocks on a weekly basis of 50,000 tons until stocks are depleted in order to minimize the impact on domestic prices.

The weekly benchmark prices of white rice for August 9-15 increased by 0.9 percent. As such, farmers will receive slightly lower compensation compared to the previous week. Farmers that sell their supplies this week will be able to arbitrage as market prices are above the benchmark prices.

#### **Rice Export Update**

Unofficial rice exports (excluding fragrant rice) for Aug 2-8, 2010 totaled 79,683 tons, down 34,606 tons from the previous week, and down 28,609 tons from the four-week moving average of 108,292 tons. Exports of white rice and parboiled rice during January 1 – August 8, 2010 totaled 3,503,014 tons, down 2.3 percent from 3,584,047 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during January 1 - July 23, 2010 amounted to 4,566,270 tons, down 8.1 percent from 4,967,068 tons in the previous year.

FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers from the Board of Trade for non-fragrant and from the Office of Commodity Standards for fragrant rice when available, but the reader should bear in mind the difference between the data
