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Potato TRQ for 2010 Announced

Report Highlights:

TH0020. On December 30, 2009, the Department of Foreign Trade (DFT), Ministry of Commerce, allocated 1,430 metric tons (MT) for seed potatoes and 36,000 MT for potatoes for processing under the 2010 TRQ.

On December 30, 2009, the Department of Foreign Trade (DFT), Ministry of Commerce authorized the allocation of 1,430 MT for seed potatoes and 36,000 MT for potatoes for processing under the 2010 TRQ. This allocation was carried-out by the Sub-Committee on Production and Marketing Management for Garlic, Shallots, Onion, and Potatoes. The import window for seed potatoes is from January 1 to December 31, 2010 while the window for potatoes for processing (stock potatoes) is from July 1 to December 31, 2010. The following companies have been assigned the following in-quota amounts for 2010:

This allocation is based on the Ministry of Commerce's Notification on the Issuance of Certificates on the Eligibility on Import Duty Payments for Potatoes under the WTO's Agreement on Agriculture for 2009-2011. The notification states that imports of all potatoes are subject to Thailand's WTO committed bound tariff rates and eligible imports must come from WTO member countries or Laos. Additional quotas may be allocated throughout the year upon the request of the aforementioned companies.

Like other agricultural commodities under a TRQ system in Thailand, the Thai Government applies domestic purchase requirements in administrating the TRQ for seed potatoes and stock potatoes. The domestic absorption practice for potatoes was reported in FAS Report: 2009 Potato TRQ and Domestic Absorption (TH9028).

In 2009, the DFT allocated a TRQ of 7,178 MT for seed potatoes and 36,000 MT for stock potatoes. According to the Thai Customs Department, actual imports of seed potatoes totaled 4,345 MT, accounting for 61 percent of the allocated quota. Meanwhile, stock potato imports were 28,223 MT, accounting for 78 percent of the quota. Trade sources reported that the unfulfilled quota was due to limited supplies of good quality potatoes (both seed and stock potatoes), cheaper domestic supplies, and the ability of chip processors to increase domestic supply through contract farming.

Trade sources reported that chipping potato sales in Thailand grew by 7 percent in 2009 and are expected to grow 8-10 percent in 2010. In 2009, imports of U.S. stock potatoes declined 42 percent from 8,538 MT in 2008 to 4,904 MT losing market share from 29.4 percent to 17.4 percent mostly to Chinese potatoes. Potatoes from China enter Thailand duty free while U.S. potatoes bear a 27 percent duty.
