Report Highlights:

Domestic and export prices declined slightly by 1-2 percent due to quiet foreign demand as buyers remained wary of Thailand's political climate and a weakening Thai Baht. As riots ensued, concerns loomed on the exporters' ability to deliver pending orders, however these proved unfounded as all shipments were delivered promptly. Additional concerns for Thai exporters are reports that foreign buyers have enough supplies that are being fulfilled by Vietnam, which could prolong the placement of new orders until mid-June. Current shipments of Thai rice are mostly those that are fulfilling outstanding contracts. Meanwhile, the Thai baht presently depreciated to 32.50 baht/\$, as compared to 32.20 baht/\$ in the previous week.

The weekly benchmark prices of white rice for May 24-30 increased slightly by 0.2 percent from the previous week; as such farmers will receive lower compensation. However, farmers that sell their supplies in this period will gain from the price insurance scheme as market prices are above the benchmark prices.

Note: If Benchmark prices are average historical wholesales prices which will be used for the calculation of compensation to farmers. The compensation is based on the difference between insurance prices and benchmark prices.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial rice exports (excluding fragrant rice) for May 17-23, 2010 totaled 115,187 tons, down 4,025 tons from the previous week, and up 643 tons from the four-week moving average of 114,544 tons. Exports of white rice and parboiled rice during January 1 – May 23, 2010 totaled 2,338,659 tons, up 5.3 percent from 2,222,002 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during January 1 – May 14, 2010 amounted to 3,024,735 tons, down 4.3 percent from 3,161,294 tons in the previous year.

FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers from the Board of Trade for non-fragrant and from the Office of Commodity Standards for fragrant rice when available, but the reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
