Report Highlights:

The U.S.-Japan Trade Agreement (USJTA) entered Year 5 of the agreement implementation on April 1, 2023. This report is one in a series of product briefs highlighting the tariff benefits for specific commodities and products from Year 5 (2023) to Year 7 (2025) of the Agreement. Overview: In 2022, the United States exported over \$11 million of pulses to Japan, making Japan its #15 overseas market. The United States accounted for nearly five percent of Japan’s total imports of pulses. The years below correspond to Japan’s fiscal year beginning April 1.

Market Considerations: Japan maintains a tariff-rate quota under the World Trade Organization (WTO) for dried leguminous vegetables including adzuki, kidney beans, peas, and other pulses. The United States is the fourth largest supplier of pulses to Japan after China, Burma, and Canada. About 60 percent of beans in Japan are used for sweet bean paste primarily as a filling for traditional desserts and pastries. While demand for bean paste has been stagnant, non-traditional use of pulses, such as chickpeas and lentils, in salads, soups and hummus is on the rise.
