Report Highlights:

TH5107 –Export prices for nearly all grades of rice, except fragrant rice, declined further from the previous week's level due to continued weakening of Thai baht.

Export prices for nearly all grades of rice, except fragrant rice, declined further from the previous week's level due to continued weakening of Thai baht, which depreciated further to 36.02 baht/US\$ from 35.7 baht/US\$ as of August 24. Sources indicate that Vietnamese rice is currently offered \$20-25/MT lower than Thai rice (new-crop 5% grade white rice). Trade sources reported that the Thai Government awarded an export sale of 100,000 metric tons (MT) of WR100 B to exporters through Thai Rice Exporters Association. This sale is under the existing G-to-G agreement with China. The contract price is reportedly of US\$ 410/MT FOB. The Thai media also reported that the Ministry of Commerce may announce a new tender of government-hold stocks by mid-September.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for August 23-30, 2015 totaled 108,974 MT, down 25,519 MT from the previous week but up 7,124 MT from the four-week moving average of 101,850 MT (Table 2). Rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) from January 1 – August 30, 2015, totaled 2,717,815 MT, down 19 percent from the same period last year.

Total rice exports from January to June 2015 totaled 4,457,927 metric tons, down 4.7 percent from the same period last year (See GAIN Report – TH5094 Grain and Feed Update, June 2015).

Note on data: *\tilde{Y} Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, starting May 1, 2013, the data will not include 100% - 25% grade white rice exports. The reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice and white rice (100%-25% grades) export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.
